

Consultation on the reduction of Pupil Admission Numbers

Fakenham Academy Norfolk

November 2016

Fakenham Academy Norfolk would like to propose reducing the Pupil Admissions Numbers with effect from 1st September 2018.

Proposal

Fakenham Academy Norfolk as the admissions authority proposes to reduce the published number of admissions for year 7 from 180 to 150 pupils with effect from 1st September 2018.

This will result in the number of places available for pupils in year 7 from September 2018 and all subsequent cohorts will be 150. For all other pupils who are already studying at Fakenham Academy Norfolk there will be no change.

We do not propose to make any other changes to our Admissions Policy.

The following factors have been considered by Fakenham Academy Norfolk on this proposal are;

- Fakenham Academy Norfolk has not had a total roll past 180 pupils for the last 5 years.
- Reducing the Pupil Admissions Numbers would allow more stringent financial controls and allow staffing and curriculum design to be appropriate to the number of pupils.
- Fakenham Academy Norfolk is committed to reviewing the Pupil Admissions Numbers if the local demographic and context dictates a need for this in the future.

How to respond

The consultation will run from 7th November 2016 to 19th December 2016 and you are invited to submit comments in writing to the Head of Registry Christopher Caddamy using email address christopher.caddamy@ccn.ac.uk

Following the consultation period Fakenham Academy Norfolk as the admissions authority will consider any comments received. The Admissions arrangements for 2018 will be determined by 31st January 2017 and any subsequent objections will need to be made to the Office of the Schools Adjudicator by 15TH May 2017.
